• **INTRODUCTION**

Maritime archaeology serves as a cornerstone in the preservation and interpretation of underwater cultural heritage. As custodians of this heritage, history and archaeological museums play a crucial role in safeguarding and disseminating cultural artifacts recovered from shipwrecks and submerged sites, including ancient urban centers and trading ports. These institutions act as vital repositories, facilitating public engagement and appreciation for the intricate narratives encoded within the depths of the ocean. Through rigorous excavation, precise documentation, and advanced conservation techniques, maritime archaeology mediates the relationship between artifacts and historical context.

This practice not only yields insights into historical trade networks, cultural practices, and quotidian life but also emphasizes the significance of diverse submerged sites and the museums dedicated to their study. Such museums serve as pivotal platforms presenting tangible evidence of maritime history while confronting challenges surrounding accessibility and public involvement. The synergy between maritime archaeology and museums illustrates a dynamic partnership that enriches our comprehension of global history, making the submerged treasures of our underwater heritage accessible to a broader audience.

This conference will explore the complexities involved in preserving and exhibiting underwater cultural heritage collections, highlighting the collaborative efforts required to connect the underwater world with the public sphere. Additionally, it will explore the trajectory from seabed recovery to museum display, analyze the implications of evolving marine and coastal environments on submerged archaeological sites, and discuss innovative technologies utilized in the mapping and documentation of these sites.

The conference is being collaboratively organized by the ICOM International Committee for Museums and Collections of Archaeology and History (ICMAH), ICOM Croatia, the International Centre for Underwater Archaeology (ICUA), the Museum of Ancient Glass (MAS), the Archaeological Museum in Zadar (AMZD), the Department of Archaeology at the University of Zadar (ZARH), and The Camille Jullian Centre for historical and archaeological research laboratory of the French National Center for Scientific Research (CNRS).

• **CONFERENCE THEMES**

This conference focuses on presenting reliable experiences, case studies, excavation projects, and research efforts that are directly relevant to the subject matter under discussion, as well as the forthcoming themes:

1. **Underwater Cultural Heritage and Climate Change:** A prominent and growing theme focusing on the impacts of changing marine and coastal environments on submerged sites and developing strategies for protection and preservation. Understanding and mitigating the impact of rising sea levels, extreme weather, and changing ocean currents on underwater cultural heritage.
2. **Conservation and Management:** Discussing the technical and legal aspects of preserving and managing underwater sites and recovered artifacts. explore the management of underwater cultural heritage within international law.
3. **Approaches for Mitigating Looting of Underwater Cultural Heritage Sites:** Investigating the innovative methodologies and practices aimed at addressing the illicit excavation, exploitation, and looting of underwater archaeological sites. Furthermore, discussing the development of robust legal frameworks that enhance protections for underwater heritage, the implementation of advanced technologies to monitor vulnerable sites, foster local stewardship, and the optimization of site management protocols, ensuring sustainable preservation.
4. **Technology and Innovation:** Highlighting innovations in mapping, documentation, and virtual access to underwater sites. Discussing the utilization of advanced tools like geophysical surveys (side-scan sonar, magnetometers), and submersibles to discover, analyze, and document sites in deep or difficult-to-reach places.
5. **Museums and Public Engagement:** Exploring the role of museums as custodians of underwater heritage and developing strategies for community involvement, accessibility, and awareness. Exploring how to "bring the past to life" through both analogue and digital practices, including museum displays, interactive exhibits, and public involvement in research.
6. **Ancient Seafaring and Trade:** Ongoing research into ancient shipwrecks (e.g., Roman, Phoenician) continues to reveal insights into historical trade networks and maritime history.

Should any participant express an interest in visiting the underwater archaeological site, two options are available. Participants may choose to engage in snorkeling or diving at the Pag island, near the village Šimuni. The diving excursion shall include:

- Letavica diving site, known for a collection of ancient Roman amphorae, is available for certified Advanced Open Water Divers (AOWD).
- Pag Island Coast, known for the Roman shipwreck with piles of broken amphorae, is available for snorkeling, and also certified Open Water Divers (OWD).

All options are subject to the weather conditions. Please note that fees will apply for diving at any site (Equipment rental and diving guide are available on-site).

- Members who have received grants in the last three years will not be eligible to receive a grant in 2026.

- Applicants under 40 years old.
- Applicants who are being accepted as one of ICOM ICMAH's Annual conference 2026 speakers.
